Illustrations by Mique Moriuchi. NCTE Notable Poetry Book, Eureka! Award winner and featured title at 2016 National Book Festival. (picture book, ages 4 and up)

WHEN THE SUN SHINES ON ANTARCTICA (And Other Poems About the Frozen Continent): Find out what penguins, seals and other Antarctic wildlife do during the summer months. Illustrations by Anna Wadham. NCTE Notable Poetry book and winner of Silver Moonbeam Award for Poetry. (picture book, ages 8 and up)

LEAVING GEE'S BEND: Inspired by The Quilts of Gee's Bend art exhibit and set in 1932 Gee's Bend, Alabama, it is a heart-touching tale in which a young girl sets out to save her sick mother and records her adventures in quilt pieces. Bank Street College Best Book and the 2011 ALLA Children's Book of the Year. (novel, ages 8 and up)

DON'T FEED THE BOY: A contemporary story about friendship that centers around Whit, who lives at the zoo, and the Bird Girl, who visits every day to escape her home life. Featured title at 2013 National Book Festival, Bank Street College Best Book and a finalist for Kansas' William Allen White Award. (novel, ages 8 and up)

DEAR WANDERING WILDEBEEST (And Other Poems from the Water Hole): Spend a day at an African water hole. Illustrations by Anna Wadham. "Latham's finely crafted verse, at once humorous and serious, dazzlingly opens the imagination to the wilds of the world." NCTE Notable Poetry Book, Bank Street College Best Book, Silver Moonbeam Award for Poetry (picture book, ages 8 and up)


